 - 10.1. **ACTION ITEM: FRATERNITY OFFICER CONTACT PRIVACY AGREEMENT**
 The executive officers receive constant requests to share contact information of fraternal officers and we will be examining our privacy agreement to determine when and how presidents and other officers would like to be contacted.
 - 10.1.1. Motion to approve the ability to share contact information of only specified officers, specified by the president of the fraternity, to all Cal Poly Students, Faculty, and staff.
 - 10.2. **INFORMATION ITEM: IFC JUNIOR EXECUTIVE BOARD**
 Following rush, IFC will be accepting applications for the IFC Junior Executive Board. 10.4. **INFORMATION ITEM: KAPPA CHI (KX)**

Kappa Chi is a fraternity that was founded in 1957 here at Cal Poly. They later merged with Theta Chi in 1969 but dissolved the partnership in 1993. Kappa Chi was barred from IFC membership in December of 2008. They have a tentative rush schedule and will be trying to recruit the same young men as you. If asked, simply say they are not a recognized Cal Poly fraternity.

10.5. Discussion: IFC Dues

10.5.1. It was told that "Chapter fund of Greek Life will start not to exceed \$10 per member", "Allocation of money will be split amongst the councils"

10.5.2. Authors put this into words so that dues would increase to a total of \$20 by 2016.

10.5.3. Instead, it has been interpreted to be an added fee on top of dues, excluding Grant Eligibilities
